## IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR IPHONE OWNERS

### Keep your bill predictable when you travel abroad.

AT&T knows that the mobile Internet on your Apple® iPhone™ is indispensable to you. **That's why we want to remind you that international data usage is not covered under your existing U.S. data plan.**

Your iPhone provides access to email, Visual Voicemail, Web browsing and other applications that can use a significant amount of data. It's no surprise that you might find yourself using more data than you thought. The good news is that now, when you're traveling outside the U.S., you can save money on your international data usage by signing up for one of AT&T's newly created Data Global Plans with low rates in 70 countries.\*

**With the many Internet-based applications on iPhone, it's natural to use more data. Opening an email with a 5 megapixel picture in it or downloading a 3-minute video on YouTube each take about 2MB of data (1MB = 1,024KB). At pay-per-use international rates, 2MB of data usage would cost almost \$40.**

#### Effective October 17, 2008

Charges for Visual Voicemail Messages received when traveling outside the U.S. will be charged at International rates – either at the International pay-per-use data rate or against your iPhone International data package.

#### To turn Visual Voicemail Messages "ON/OFF"

Receipt of Visual Voicemail Messages when traveling outside the U.S. is controlled by the Data Roaming setting.\*\*

To turn "ON/OFF" Receipt of Visual Voicemail Messages tap on Settings>General>Network>Data Roaming.

Note that turning on the Data Roaming toggle when traveling outside the U.S. can result in substantial roaming charges that are not covered under your existing U.S. data plan.

\*\* With iPhone software version 2.0 and higher.

Here are some easy ways to help you minimize international data charges when you travel outside the U.S.

- **Turn Data Roaming "OFF":** Be sure to download and install the latest version of iPhone software from iTunes. By default the setting for international data roaming will be in the "OFF" position.

*To turn data roaming "ON/OFF" tap on Settings>General>Network>Data Roaming*

- **Use WiFi Instead of 3G/GPRS/EDGE:** WiFi is available in many international airports, hotels and restaurants to browse the Web or check email.

- **Turn Fetch New Data "Off":** Check email and sync contacts and calendars manually instead of having the data pushed to your iPhone automatically. This way you can control the flow of data coming to your iPhone.

*To turn off the Auto-Check functionality tap on Settings>Fetch New Data, Change Push to "OFF" and Select to Fetch Manually*

- **Consider Purchasing an International Data Package:**

If you are traveling outside the U.S., purchasing a Data Global Plan will significantly reduce the cost of using data abroad.

- **Reset the Usage Tracker to Zero:** When you arrive overseas access the usage tracker in the general settings menu and select reset statistics. This will enable you to track your estimated data usage.

*To reset Usage Tracker to Zero tap on Settings>General>Usage>Reset*
